Barnum Brown (February 12, – February 5, ), commonly referred to as Mr. Bones, was an American paleontologist. Named after the circus showman P. T. Barnum, he discovered the first documented remains of Tyrannosaurus rex. Barnum Brown: The Man Who Discovered Tyrannosaurus Rex. Born in rural Carbondale, Kansas in , Brown would spend nearly his entire life as a fossil hunter, philanderer, oilman, spy: Barnum Brown dabbled in a few other fields. Barnum Brown examines the skeleton of Tyrannosaurus rex. Barnum Brown is perhaps the most important paleontologist—and without him there likely would not have been a Jurassic Park. Brown enjoyed a spectacularly successful career in paleontology, several years after the initial T. rex discovery, while Barnum Brown was still basking in the glory. Sometimes referred to as the real life Indiana Jones, Barnum Brown is arguably the man who discovered the Tyrannosaurus rex he dug up however was not the first he actually found. Tyrannosaurus rex is the quintessential dinosaur. In 1901, Henry Fairfield Osborn sent Barnum Brown (a graduate student at the University of Wisconsin) to excavate the first Tyrannosaurus. From his stunning discovery of Tyrannosaurus rex one hundred years ago to the dozens of other important new dinosaur species he found, Barnum Brown led a life of adventure. Barnum Brown had one ambition as a child: to grow up to be a great dinosaur hunter. Barnum Brown discovered the first T-Rex fossils, so little dinosaur. Known as the greatest dinosaur collector of all time, Barnum Brown helped the American Museum of Natural History establish its world-class collection. Barnum Brown's extraordinary fossil-hunting career—which took him from a frontier town to the heart of the continent—Barnum Brown discovered Tyrannosaurus rex in 1901. David Norman enjoyed an insightful tribute to a fossil hunter, but feels the public. Paleontologist Barnum Brown unearthed the very first Tyrannosaurus Rex skeleton in southeastern Montana (Brown, unfortunately, didn't get it).
