**Congress and the Nation: Vol. 5, 1977-1980.** Edited by Martha V. Gottron. (Washington, D.C.: Congressional Quarterly, 1981. Pp. xx + 1240. \$85.00.)

This hefty volume covers the basic legislative and executive chronology of American politics during the Carter administration. (Volumes 1 to 4 cover the period from 1945 to 1976.) A general chronology of the Carter years is followed by detailed chronological developments in foreign policy, national security, economic policy, commerce and transportation, agriculture policy, labor and management, housing and urban affairs, energy policy, environmental policy, health, education, and welfare, law and justice, general government, Congress, and the Carter presidency. An appendix includes information on key votes, Congressional committees, subcommittees, and members, presidential cabinets, nominations, vetoes, and messages, election returns by state, and more. The volume documents the Carter struggles with energy, the economy, and foreign affairs and illustrates the period's decreased emphasis on domestic social programs.

**War Through Children's Eyes: The Soviet Occupation of Poland and the Deportations, 1939-1941.** Edited and compiled by Irena Grudzinska-Gross and Jan Tomasz Gross. Translated by Ronald Strom and Dan Rivers. (Stanford, Calif.: Hoover Institution Press, 1981. Pp. xxviii + 260. \$21.95.)

Subsequent to the Soviet occupation of eastern Poland in 1939, more than one million Poles, many of them children, were deported to the Soviet Union. With the German attack on the Soviet Union in 1941, the exiled Polish government reached an agreement with the Soviets that allowed transfer of many deportees to British camps in the Middle East. Here in Polish-run schools these children wrote essays about their experiences during the invasion, occupation, and deportation. The 120 essays compiled here were translated from those Polish school children's compositions. In essays can be found a child's-eye view of social and cultural disruption,

deprivation and despair, nationalism and religion, and more.

**Information Sources of Political Science, Third Edition.** By Frederick L. Holler. (Santa Barbara, Calif.: American Bibliographical Center, Clio Press, 1981. Pp. x + 278. \$65.00.)

Now under one cover, this third edition also includes computerized reference tools that have been developed over the past several years. An introductory chapter joins the continued discussion about a proper classification for political science knowledge. Other sections include general reference sources, those of interest to social scientists, and specific reference sources for American government, politics, public law, international relations and organizations, comparative politics and area studies, political theory, and public administration. Subject, author, and title indexes complement the annotations of reference sources for political science researchers and teachers.

**Cumulations in International Relations Research.** Vol. 18, Book 3. Edited by P. Terrence Hopmann, Dina A. Zinnes, and J. David Singer. (Denver: Monograph Series in World Affairs, 1981. Pp. xi + 136. \$5.00, paper.)

This survey examines the continued drive toward a science of international relations. The editors argue that contemporary research in international relations has provided some pieces to the puzzle, but the puzzle itself remains ill-defined. International relations puzzle-solvers, like their counterparts in other areas of political science, lack an organizing paradigm that specifies what goes-with-what, how this-goes-with-that, and why. Included are surveys on theories of war, analyses of international alliances, research on crisis analysis, and a review of foreign policy evaluation.
